Nadya March holds an ARCT diploma from The Royal Conservatory of Music, a Licentiate diploma from the University of Manitoba, a Bachelor of Arts degree and Certificate of Education from the University of Manitoba, a Bachelor of Music from Brandon University, and a Master's degree in Piano Performance with Distinction from Indiana University School of Music. While at Indiana, she pursued doctoral studies in piano pedagogy, and completed all coursework and doctoral recitals. Ms. March's main piano teachers in Canada were John Melnyk and Gordon Macpherson. In the United States, she studied with Alfonso Montecino, John Ogdon, Balint Vaszonyi, and Michel Block.

While employed as a piano instructor at Medicine Hat College for three years, Ms. March performed solo and chamber recitals as part of the Medicine Hat Public Library Series and at the University of Lethbridge noon hour series. She taught piano, chamber music and accompanying classes at the University of Saskatchewan for seven years. Ms. March has also adjudicated at numerous festivals in Saskatchewan, as well as at the Winnipeg Music Festival. Currently, Ms. March is active as a teacher of piano and theory in her home studio, and as a rehearsal coach and accompanist for performance students and choirs at the Christian Center Academy in Saskatoon. She regularly performs her own solo piano arrangements of contemporary Christian choruses.
