Currently, she is an instructor in music history at the University of Western Ontario and at McMaster University where she also teaches a graduate course in performance practice.

Dr. Minevich maintains a private studio and is also a clarinet instructor at Wilfrid Laurier University and is a member of the faculty trio Contrasts, which gives concerts throughout Ontario. She has also performed with the Canadian Chamber Ensemble, the Kitchener-Waterloo Symphony, Orchestra London, and the Stratford Shakespearean Festival, and she has been heard on a number of radio and television broadcasts. In addition, she is a featured soloist on two CDs: Mildred's Music (music by Canadian composer Peter Hatch) and Music at Laurier (faculty performances). She is a member of the International Clarinet Society and the Canadian University Music Society.
